	misspell	to spell (a word or name) incorrectly
	broach	to make known for the first time : to open up (a subject) for discussion
	deontological	(philosophy) (of an ethical theory) regarding obligation as deriving from reason or as residing primarily in certain specific rules of conduct rather than in the maximization of some good
	propolis	a brownish resinous material of waxy consistency collected by bees from the buds of trees and used as a cement in repairing and maintaining the hive
	inoculate	treat with a vaccine containing a dead or modified disease causing agent to promote immunity against the disease
	duologue	a dialogue between two persons
	camaraderie	a mutual trust and sociability among friends
	bellwether	a person, thing, or event which presages incipient change
	privilege	a right or benefit that is given to some people and not to others : a special opportunity to do something that makes you proud
	dumbbell	a short bar with weights at each end that is used usually in pairs for exercise : a stupid person
	injera	a soft, white, spongy Ethiopian bread made from teff flour
	maelstrom	a state of turbulence or confusion ; a powerful often violent whirlpool sucking in objects within a given radius
	phrenology	the study of the conformation of the skull based on the belief that it is indicative of mental faculties and character

	cyanotic	a bluish or purplish discoloration (as of skin) due to deficient oxygenation of the blood
